# Books Published in 1997

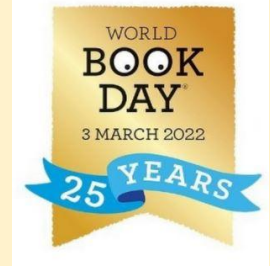


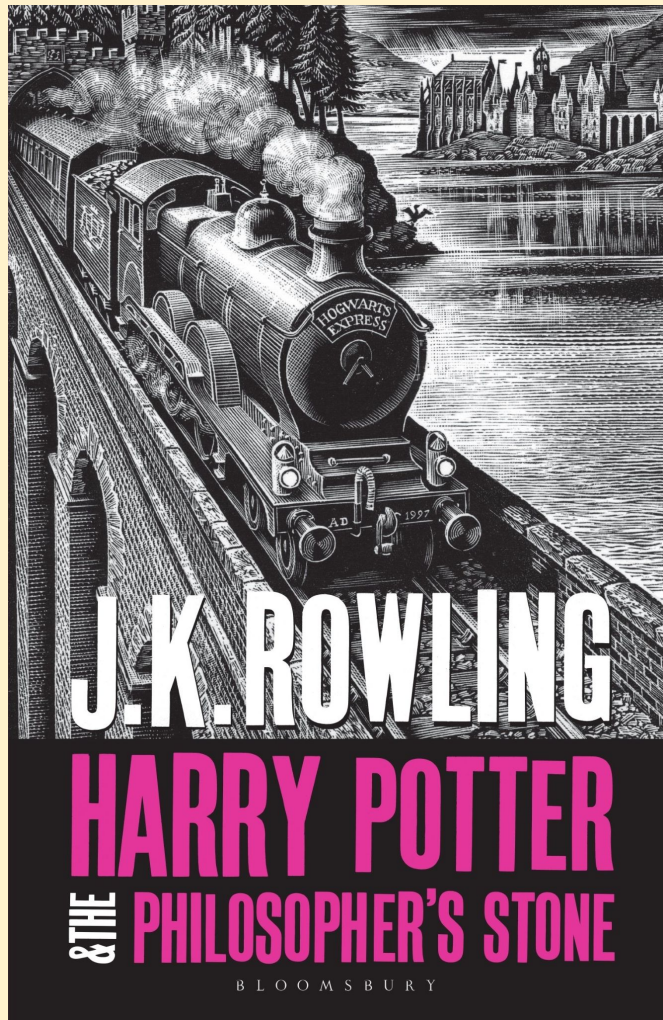
Every year thousands of new books are published. Most quickly become out of print.

Which books first published in 1997, are still in the library today?

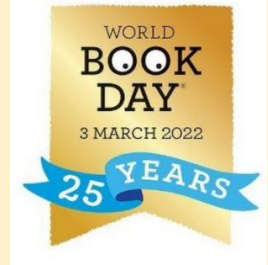

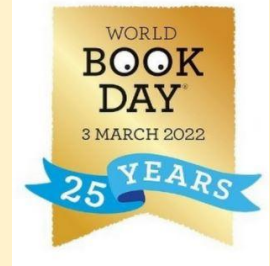


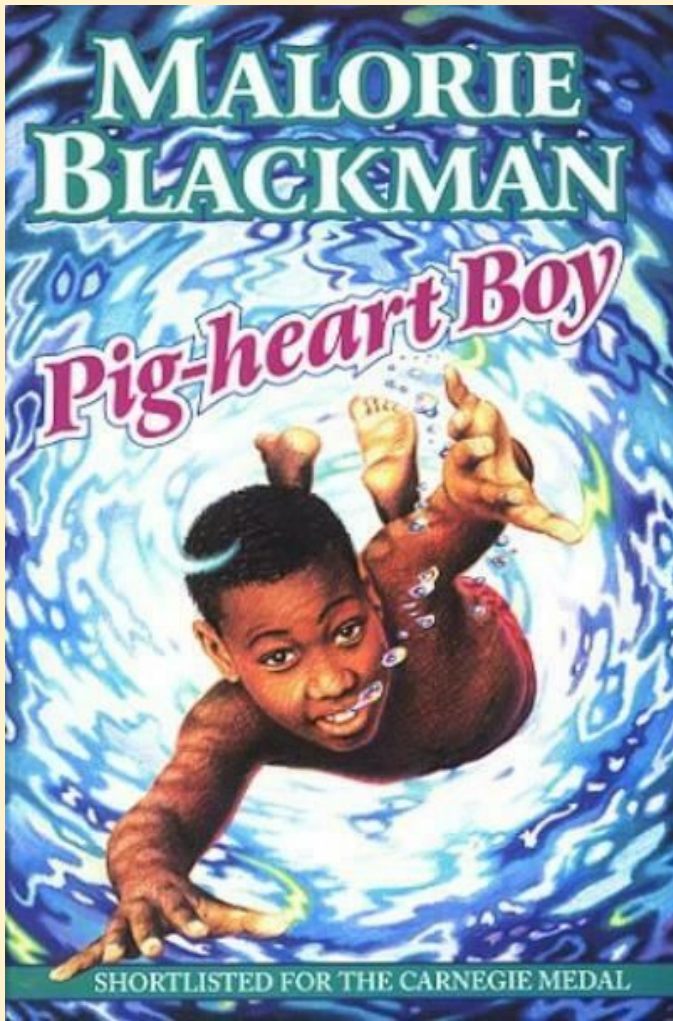




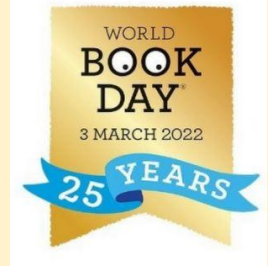
Also published in 1997 was the eagerly awaited second book in Philip Pullman's "His Dark Materials" series.

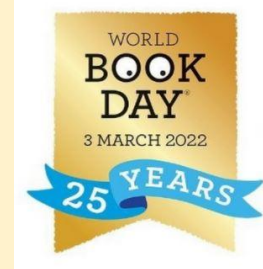
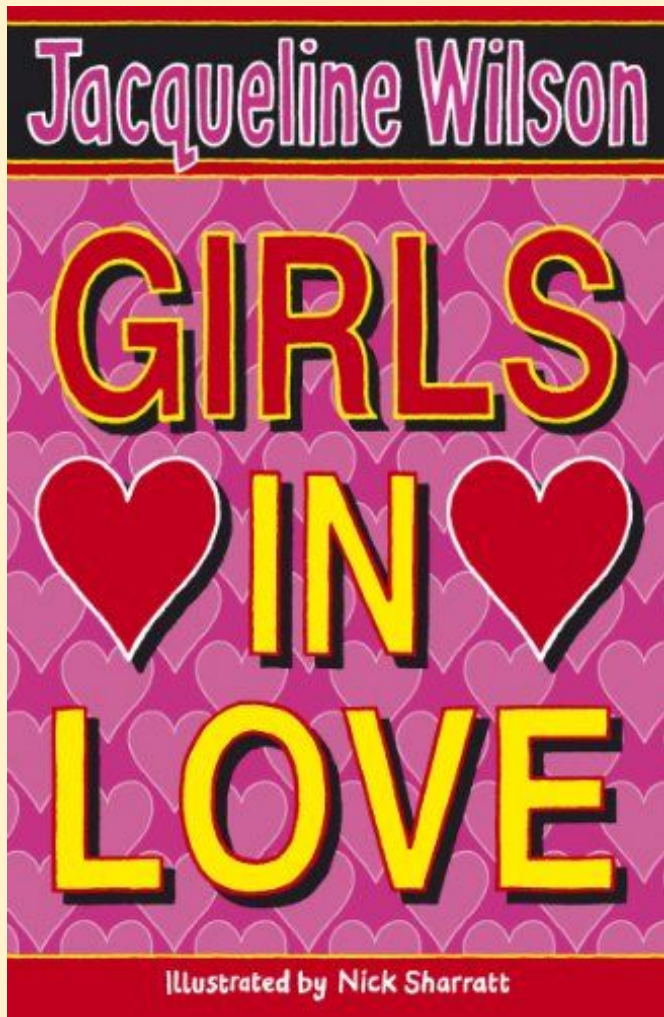
The first book "Northern Lights" won the Carnegie Medal in 1995. Like Harry Potter this series is now an established classic.



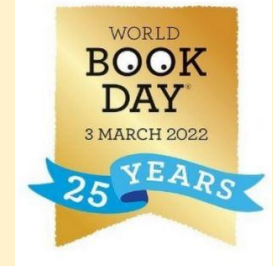
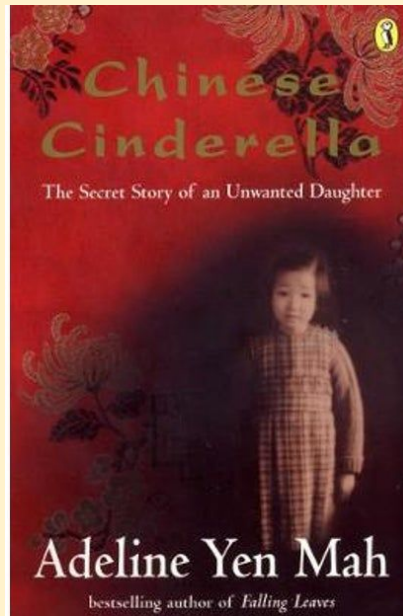
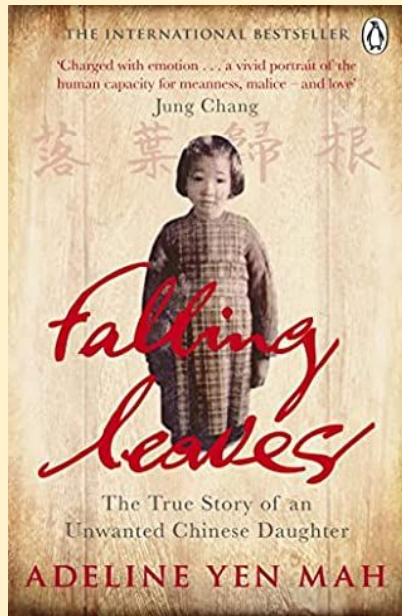

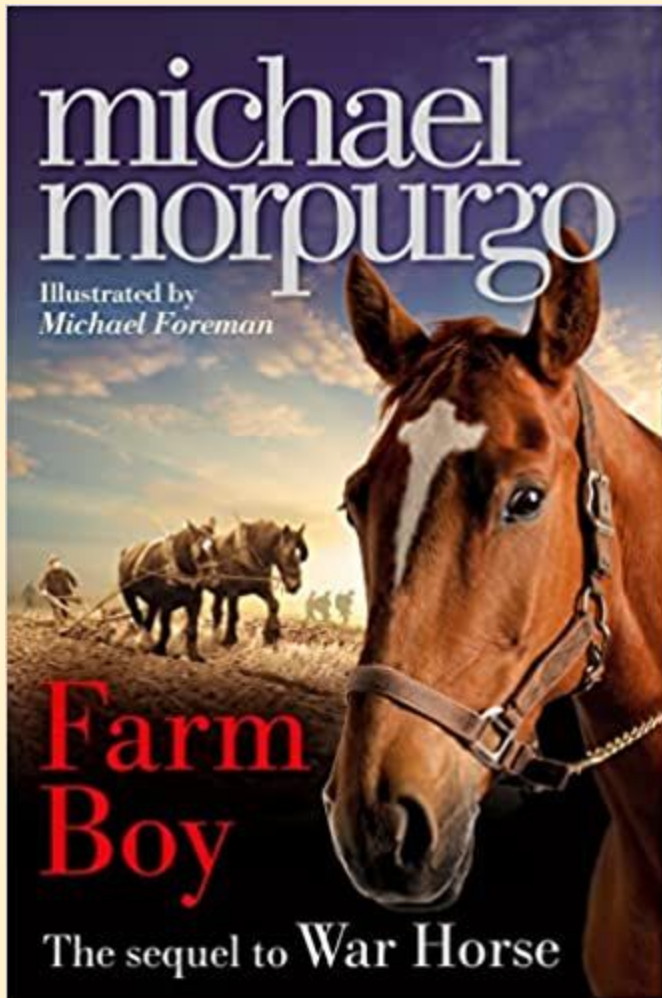




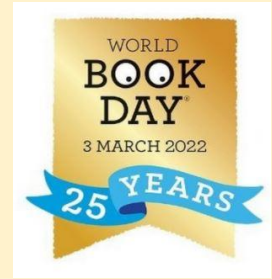
Although we still have a large collection of books by Jacqueline Wilson in the library, they are not as popular as they were. In 1997 all her books were in constant demand

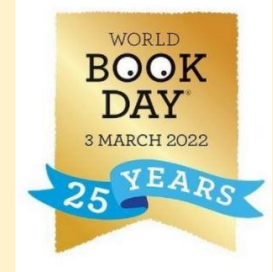
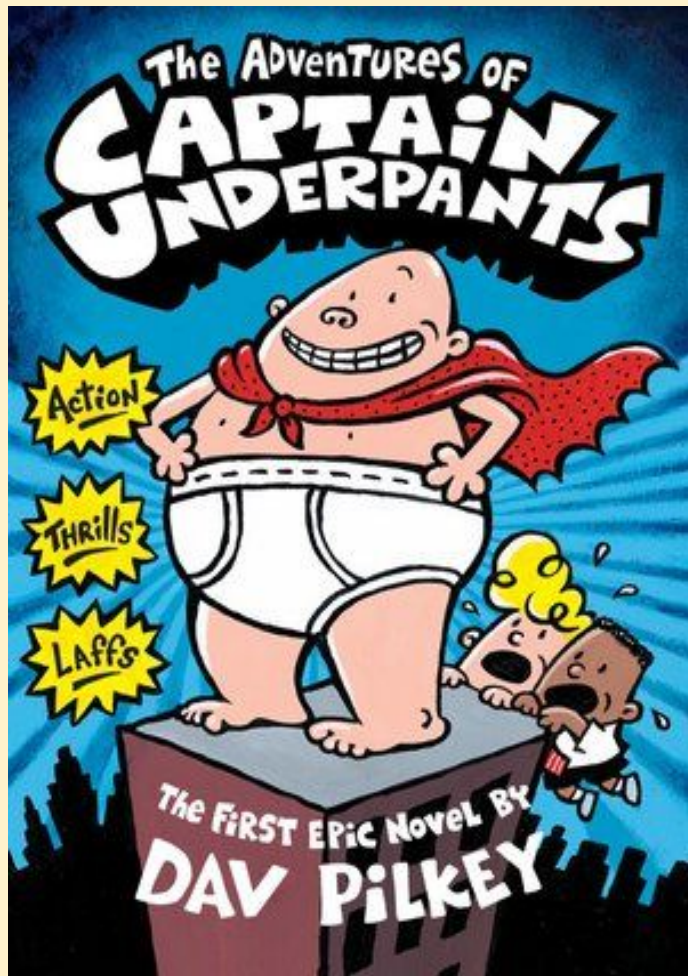

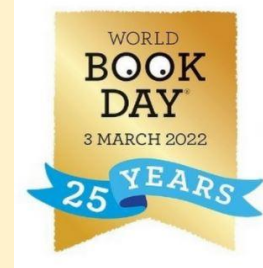
# CSG World Book Day 2022
