
History of Camden School for Girls

Frances Mary Buss is recognised as a pioneer in girls' education and in teacher training. Her pupils were amongst the first girls to take public examinations and to go to university, and many went on to become pioneers themselves. Her school became the model for girls' schools throughout the country and indeed the world.

Camden School for Girls Results 2022

GCSE

- Grades 9-7 59% (National: 26%)
- Grades 9-5 88% (National: 58%)
- Grades 9-4 95% (National: 73%)

Attainment of the top grades is at a record high, higher than both CAGs and TAGs at Grades 9-7, in addition to:

- 23% of all grades at a Grade 9 (7% Nationally)
- 9 students achieved eight or more Grade 9s
- 30 students achieved eight or more Grades 9-8

Progression:

English and Maths: 96% students gained 9 - 4 and 87% gained 9 - 5

A Level

- Percentage A*
 28% (National 15%)
- Percentage A* A 56% (National 36%)
- Percentage A* B 83% (National 62%)

The proportion of students achieving the highest grades is the highest in 5 years of formal examinations, almost doubling our own A*s in 2019.

In addition, we have:

- 29 students achieving straight A* grades
- 89 students achieving straight A* A grades.

19 of our students who are going on to study at Oxford or Cambridge

22 of our students are going to Art Schools, including Central St Martins and Camberwell.



The Admissions Process

120 places are offered representing the full range of ability.

Applicants sit a banding assessment and are placed in one of four ability bands.


30 places are offered in each band in the following priority:

- 1. A statement of special educational needs (EHCP)
- 2. Looked after and previously looked after children
- 3. Siblings (to qualify the older sibling must be on roll still in September 2023)
- 4. Exceptional medical or social need
- 5. Musical aptitude and / or ability
- 6. Distance

In addition to the banding (and music assessment if relevant) you must complete an e-admissions application. This is where you list your 6 school choices in order of preference. The deadline is October 31 2022.

Music Places

8 music places are offered in total. 3 in music aptitude and 5 in music aptitude and ability.

Applicants sit a music aptitude assessment - a multiple choice listening aptitude test in music. Results for the assessment are emailed on Friday 7 October. The 3 highest scoring are offered a place and the next 50 highest scoring are invited to audition.

Auditions last 5 minutes in total and up to 2 instruments can be played. Voice is considered an instrument. The 5 highest scoring out of the 50 who audition are offered a place.

Results from the music auditions are shared on Friday 21 October including waiting lists positions for both the music aptitude and the music aptitude and ability processes and any declined places are filled from this lists in rank order. Anyone on these lists that applies to the school who is not successful is considered under the Distance criterion instead unless applying under a higher criteria.
